Fifth Sunday of Lent – Year A

Fr. Mark writes: Today is 'Passion' Sunday: the statues are veiled, the prayers of Mass emphasize Our Lord's impending suffering and Cross. He is close to us in these days of difficulty and suffering. He knows what we endure; He offers us hope and comfort. Even now the readings point beyond the Cross. Ezekiel relays God's promise: 'I mean to raise you from your graves, my people.' The Psalm: 'With the Lord there is mercy and fullness of redemption.' The Gospel in which Jesus raises Lazarus from the dead. Jesus responds to the entreaties of Lazarus's distraught sisters. 'This sickness will not end in death but in God's glory.' Jesus speaks and acts not just for the benefit of Lazarus, but for all the faithful: 'If anyone believes in

Me, even though he dies he will leave.' The proof is the raising of Lazarus, the Resurrection itself.

Communication

It is vital that we maintain contact with one another. Do pick up the phone regularly to the elderly and the self-isolating. Check how they are, chat with them, pray with them. Visiting

To restrict the spread of the virus, there is currently no routine visiting of the sick and the housebound. We aim to maintain phone contact. Fr. Mark is available to give the Sacrament of the Sick (anointing) to the seriously ill and the dying.

Masses

The fact the church building is closed, does not mean that the Church is closed. God willing, I will continue to offer daily Mass without a congregation. The Mass intentions will be said by myself or Fr. William. On Sundays I will offer the Mass *pro populo*, for you, the people of the parish. In doing so, our sufferings and anxieties are united to the great prayer of Jesus on the Cross and are heard by God the Father. Rule of Life

We need structure in our life. It is how we function as human beings. It is a good thing, provided we incorporate flexibility when necessary. Our daily routines have been completely disrupted, leaving us feeling insecure and bewildered. Accept that disruption. There is no point raging against something we can't change. Rather, let's create new rhythms for daily life.

The Church has had 2,000 years of practice in this area. She has always recommended that priests, monks and nuns have a rule of life - a regular pattern of daily life, where, all things being equal, we plan out our day in terms of prayer, work, study, meals and recreation. It is something we can all adapt into our own lives and, in the process, draw closer to God.

I have created a simple 'Rule of Life' which I have posted to the parish Web site with this newsletter. It gives a series of prayers and devotions and suggested times when they might be used. This is meant to be flexible. Use what you find helpful and adapt the times as might be helpful to you.

Spiritual Communion

When we can't receive Holy Communion: 'My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Holy Sacrament of the altar. I love You above all things and I passionately desire to receive you into my soul. Since I cannot now receive You sacramentally, come spiritually into my soul so that I may unite myself wholly to You now and forever. Amen.'

Act of Contrition

When unable to go to Confession (with sorrow for our sins, the intention to amend our lives and to go to Confession in the future when possible: 'O my God, I am sorry for my sins with all my heart. In choosing to do wrong and failing to do good, I have sinned against You, Whom I should love above all things. I firmly intend, with Your help, to do penance, to sin no more, and to avoid whatever leads me into sin. Our Saviour Jesus Christ suffered and died for us. In His Name, my God, have mercy."

Spiritual Resources

We did not choose this time of crisis, but we can turn it to our advantage to increase our knowledge and wonder about God and the human person. There are many great resources – anything on You Tube produced by Bishop Robert Barron or Fr. Mike Schmitz is always worth watching. I appreciate that many older parishioners do not have access to the Internet, and am grateful to younger family members who have set this up for them in some cases. We don't need the Internet, however, to pray. Pick up a Bible, missal or rosary – or, best of all, talk to God in your own words.

Sub tuum praesidium

It is the natural instinct to turn to our mothers in time of difficulty and danger. It is the same with our Mother in heaven, who continues to care for her children. One of the oldest Christian prayers, dating back over 1,700 years invokes the help of Our Lady. Let us turn to her now: We fly to thy protection, O holy Mother of God, despise not our petitions in our necessities, but deliver us from all dangers, O glorious and blessed Virgin.'
