Second Sunday in Lent – Year B



Fr. Mark writes: Many of the most important events in the Bible take place on mountains. God gives Israel the Commandments on Mount Sinai. By tradition, last week's Gospel occurred on the Mount of Temptation outside Jericho. It is the same with today's readings. The (averted) sacrifice of Isaac by Abraham takes place on Mount Moriah. The Transfiguration of Our Lord occurs on Mount Nebo. Mountains are places of silence, away from the noise of everyday life, where we are better able to hear God speaking to us. They give us a particular vantage point, we can see the plain spread out beneath us, we gain a new perspective. Having climbed a few mountains in the Holy Land, it can be hard work in the heat and

involve a great deal of effort, like anything worthwhile. How spiritually, if not physically, can we scale the heights this Lent to encounter God and hear His message to us?

Road Map out of Lockdown

Let us pray, as the Prime Minister suggests, that we can indeed return safely to some form of normality by 21 June. Hopefully, restrictions applying to churches will be eased gradually before then. The situation at the moment, however, remains the same:

- 1. Funeral Masses are subject to a maximum of 30 mourners.
- 2. Baptisms are only permitted within scheduled Masses.
- 3. Weddings are only permitted in emergency situations if one of the couple is seriously ill.

Public Masses

It is good to see numbers gradually increasing as the vaccination programme is rolled out and confidence returns. The Sunday evening Mass remains the quietest Mass.

- 1. The church opens 15 minutes before Mass begins.
- 2. For track and tracing, please give your details to the steward or scan the barcode on the posters.
- 3. At the Sunday Masses please fill the church from the front and sit where indicated by the green ticks. Those in the same household can sit together, ensuring you are always at least 1 metre from the next person/household.
- 4. If receiving Holy Communion, please wait to be guided by the stewards.
- 5. Face coverings (covering mouth and nose) are required except for those with exemptions.
- 6. Please only use the loos if necessary.
- 7. Please leave the church promptly after Mass and avoid gathering on the forecourt afterwards.

Visiting

Routine visiting of the sick and housebound remains suspended to prevent transmission of the virus. Hopefully, with the rollout of the vaccine, it will become possible again soon. Priests are available to minister the sacraments in emergency/end of life situations. In a hospital, contact the Catholic chaplain on admission. I am willing to celebrate the Last Rites for anyone at home. Some nursing homes are again allowing this. It is one of the most important spiritual duties we can perform for the dying.

Cardinal's Lenten Appeal

Charitable giving to those in need is part of our Lenten discipline. This year, the Cardinal is asking us to think about families who are struggling to put food on the table. Poverty is deepening across the Diocese and the need for foodbanks and supermarket vouchers has accelerated. Through your generosity the Church continues to provide food to those most in need. You can give by taking one of the donation envelopes from the back of church and returning it in the collecting baskets or through the Parish House letterbox. Alternatively, you can scan the QR code on those envelopes or the posters at the back of church and give online, avoiding the need to handle cash.
