Twenty-Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time – Year B



Fr. Mark writes: The Gospel is Jesus's teaching on marriage. He reminds the Pharisees and us that marriage is not a human construct, not something which Parliament nor even the Church can change on a whim. Jesus cuts through the argument and takes us back to 'the beginning' to recover God's plan for marriage. Marriage is something God-given, written in to human nature as we are created by God. Marriage reflects something of the love and life of the Blessed Trinity. Made in the image and likeness of God, we are called to live out that model of loving in our relationships. Therefore, marriage is indissoluble, it is for life. 'What God has united, man must not divide.' Marriage is about the mutual and complementary

love of man and woman which is fruitful in the gift of children. Sublime teaching, but also difficult for us to fulfil, which is precisely why Jesus gives us the grace of the sacrament, the importance of marrying in church and making this a fully Christian marriage.

We retain the same format of coming forward to Holy Communion, bench by bench, starting with the side aisles and the back, and returning to our seats by the side aisles. It makes for less crowding and a more dignified reception of Holy Communion. Those at the front of the side aisles should start making their way forward as soon as the priest receives Communion, rather than waiting for him to come down to the altar steps.

Thinking of becoming a Catholic? Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

Jesus Christ calls all to be a full member of His Catholic Church through the sacraments of initiation: baptism, Confirmation and Holy Communion, believing in Him, living out our faith in Sunday worship and daily life. The RCIA group meets in the Parish House at **8 pm** most Tuesday evenings, starting this **Tuesday, 5 October**. It is for adults previously of no faith or other faiths, other Christians who wish to become Catholic, and Catholics who missed out on sacraments when younger. We reflect on what Catholics believe and how we live our faith. If right for them, the individuals receive the sacraments at the Easter Vigil on Saturday, 16 April 2022. School References

Fr. Mark is available to sign priest references for applications to Catholic secondary schools: 7-9 pm, tomorrow Monday, 4 October; 2-4 pm, Saturday, 16 October and 7-9 pm, Friday, 22 October. Just one parent/carer (who comes to Mass here) and the child should attend. Please bring the Certificate of Catholic Practice (one per school) having completed your child's details and your child's baptism certificate (if the baptism did not take place here). We have an appointment system. To book an appointment, please E-Mail Laurence, the catechist, at shepherdsbushcat@rcdow.org.uk letting him know which of the three dates you can make. He will E-Mail you to confirm the time. In seeking a reference, you are asking the priest to confirm that your child is a baptised Catholic and the family have attended Mass each Sunday over a number of years – at least before the pandemic. If you have recently moved into the parish or attend Mass more regularly elsewhere, it makes sense to seek a reference from that other parish. (Primary school references will be offered later in the year.)

Contactless Giving
