Fr. Mark writes: At the beginning of Jesus's public ministry, St. Paul asks us to appreciate the gifts of the Holy Spirit which are freely available to all who believe and live in Christ. These gifts are extraordinary, but they are an ordinary part of the life of the Church. We should expect them and use them

We are simply asked to be humble. These are, after all the gifts of the Spirit, not own achievements. And it has nothing to do with individualism and pride. The Holy Spirit distributes gifts as He chooses and it is always for the good of the body, the Church as a whole. We should rejoice in the gifts enjoyed by others. We should recognise the gifts we ourselves have received and put them to use to help others. None of us

should say we lack gifts. Faith, as St. Paul makes clear, is a gift. When others are struggling or in doubt, often the witness of our faith in Jesus Christ provides them with tremendous hope and encouragement.
