Fourth Sunday of Lent (Laetare) - Year A



Fr. Mark writes: Another of the long Gospel readings which are given to us on the later Sundays of Lent. Perhaps the reason for these lengthy readings is to show us that the journey to faith is, for most, a process rather than a moment. God offers us the time we need to come to a decision, but at the end of the day we must decide. It seems to take everyone concerned some time to recognise the true identity of Jesus and what becomes possible with faith in Him. Like so many today, the man's parents are noncommittal, refusing to go beyond the surface. Yes, they acknowledge something extraordinary has happened, but they are not prepared to investigate the cause of this, i.e. contact with Jesus. The Pharisees are worse. They close their

minds, conclusively refusing to accept that Jesus can heals bodies and souls. Even with the blind man himself, it is a slow process. Firstly, he can only say that 'the man called Jesus' healed him. It takes ongoing contact with Jesus to move him forward, but at least he is willing to make that journey. On reflection, he is able to say that Jesus 'is a prophet'. He continues to engage with Jesus, as we should in prayer and worship, and that finally allows him to accept Jesus as the Son of Man, to believe and to worship Him.
