Twenty-Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time - Year A



Fr. Mark writes: God, fortunately, is in the business of saving souls, rather than saving pennies. His business model in the Gospel is disastrous – paying all workers the same regardless of the hours they have put in. No wonder there are complaints from those who have been working from the outset. The parable, however, isn't about economics, but rather about the sheer generosity of God's love, which exceeds everything we can possibly imagine.

A caveat. Here we see things here from God's perspective. It is not an invitation for us to delay conversion, a relationship of faith with Him. We don't if we will be around at the end of the day. We respond instantly when we first hear God's call.

Thinking of becoming a Catholic? RCIA

Jesus calls all of us to the greatest degree of unity with Himself through the sacraments of baptism, Confirmation and Holy Communion as members of the Catholic Church. It is reflected in our faith in Him and lives of worship, truth, morality and compassion. In the past these sacraments were normally received at a young age. Increasingly, this may not be the case – the reason for the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. The RCIA group meets at **8 pm** most Tuesdays, starting on **Tuesday, 3 October**. It is for those previously of no faith or other faiths, other Christians who wish to become Catholic, and Catholics who missed out on First Communion or Confirmation when younger. It is an opportunity to reflect on what Catholics believe, how we pray and live our faith in the world. It is a journey of discovery which those in previous years have found enormously fulfilling. There are no expectations. Only if right for the individual, do they receive baptism, Confirmation and/or Communion at the Easter Vigil on Saturday, 30 March 2024. First Holy Communion

The 2024 First Holy Communion programme starts with a parents' meeting on **Sunday**, **8 October**. The programme is for the children of families attending here Mass each Sunday who are entering school Year 3. The commitment to Sunday Mass – before, during and after the programme – is crucial if we are to practise our own faith with integrity and help our children grow in their faith. The children meet at the Good Shepherd School on Sunday mornings during term time (normally alternate weeks) and attend the 11 am Mass together afterwards. The celebration of First Holy Communion itself will be at two Masses specifically for the children at 12 noon on **Saturday**, **11** and **18 May 2024**. Application forms are available at the back of church. Please return these to Jonathan, the parish catechist, by the end of the week.
