Sixth Sunday of Easter - Year B



Fr. Mark writes: They say that in his old age in exile on Patmos St. John had one message which he preached constantly: 'Little children, love one another.' When asked why he was so insistent, St. John would reply it was because this was what the Master always said.

It is certainly the constant refrain of St. John's Gospel and of his Letters: 'This is My commandment: love one another as I have loved you.' In the Second Reading

and the Gospel the word 'love' appears 18 times. We get the message: Christianity is all about love. Yet St. John is clear: we need to understand what we mean by the word 'love'. 'This is the love I mean: not our love for God, but God's love for us when He sent His Son to be the sacrifice that takes our sins away.' We are to love one another as Jesus has loved us. Yes, love will save the world, but it is a specific form of loving, that shown by Jesus Himself. It's not sentimental love. It is love which is an act of the will, love which is unconditional and sacrificial, love which is always based on truth.

Baptism

Missionary Appeal

The objective is to raise awareness of the missionary vocation, to encourage people to become involved in the Church's missionary work, and to thank those who support the missions.
