Assisted Suicide

I am grateful to the three parishioners who accompanied me on Monday to visit our MP Andy Slaughter to make known our opposition to the assisted suicide proposals. Andy Slaughter was courteous and gave us an hour of his time. He made it clear, however, that, while he would examine the proposed safeguards, he supported the principle. By the time you read this, we should know whether the legislation will proceed. If it does, it will be a very sad and disturbing day in which Parliament alters the current presumption that human life is to be protected. Please pray for our legislators and all those affected by this proposal.
