Fr. Mark writes: 'If the Spirit of Him who raised Jesus from the dead will also give life to your mortal bodies through His Spirit who dwells in you.' What, in practice, does Pentecost mean for us?

Corpus Christi – Blessed Sacrament Procession & Parish Picnic

Weather permitting, we will have our Blessed Sacrament procession on the Feast of Corpus Christi, Sunday, 22 June. Rather than being in the afternoon (as in previous years), the procession will take place immediately after the 11.00 am Mass, which will be the Celebration Mass for the First Holy Communion children. The children are encouraged to wear their First Holy Communion clothes. Like last year, we will start and finish in the church, making a circuit round Ashchurch Terrace, Ashchurch Park Villas, Goldhawk Road and back into Ashchurch Grove. After Benediction in the church, we will go to Ravenscourt Park for a Picnic in the Park – in the railed area between the lake and the children's play area. Please bring food and drink, and ensure all rubbish is cleared away subsequently. This is a wonderful and joyful public act of witness to Jesus, truly present in the Blessed Sacrament, and something which helps children appreciate their Catholic identity. And we have the opportunity to enjoy one another's company.
