Twenty-Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time - Year C



Fr. Mark writes: It can read as one of Jesus's stranger parables. Is Our Lord really commending the manager in the parable for his dishonesty? We need to read on. That isn't what Jesus is doing at all. Rather, He is making a comparison. He is pointing at the effort and ingenuity with which people manage their financial and secular affairs. He then challenges His audience and us by asking whether we give anything like as much effort and attention to our spiritual lives.

Yet money and possessions are passing; the spiritual life concerns that which is eternal. In 2,000 years, matters have only gone in one direction. We are more and more distracted by material goods which. although necessary, are secondary. We need to assess and focus on what is truly important.

He will E-Mail you to confirm the time. In seeking a reference, you are asking the priest to confirm whether you have attended Mass each Sunday here over a number of years. If you have recently moved into the parish or attend Mass more regularly elsewhere, it makes sense to seek a reference from that other parish. (Primary school references will be offered later in the year.)

Thinking of becoming a Catholic? RCIA

In the past the sacraments of baptism, Confirmation and Holy Communion were normally received at a young age. Increasingly, this may not be the case – the reason for the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. The RCIA group meets at 8 pm most Tuesdays, starting on Tuesday, 30 September. It is for those previously of no faith or other faiths, other Christians who wish to become Catholics, and Catholics who missed out on sacraments when younger. We reflect on what Catholics believe, how we pray, and how we live our faith in the world. It is a journey of discovery and explanation which those in previous years found enormously fulfilling. There are no expectations. Only if right for the individual, do they receive the sacraments at the Easter Vigil on Saturday, 4 April 2026. Annual Mass Count

The annual Mass count takes place today and over the next three Sundays. Last year there was an average of 545 people at Mass here each Sunday, making this one of the larger parishes in the area. Numbers are gradually returning to the pre-pandemic levels and the age profile seems to be getting younger. This is all very encouraging. We shall see whether that trend is continuing.

First Holy Communion

The First Confession and First Holy Communion programme starts with a parents' meeting in church at **3.00 pm** on **Sunday**, **5 October**. The programme is for the children of families attending here Mass each Sunday who are in school Year 3 or above. The commitment to Sunday Mass – before, during and after the programme – is crucial if we are to practise our own faith with integrity and help our children grow in their faith. The children meet in the Good Shepherd School on Sunday mornings during school term time (normally alternate weeks) and attend the 11 am Mass together afterwards. The celebration of First Holy Communion itself will be at two Masses at 12 noon on **Saturday**, **16** and **23 May 2026**. Green application forms are available at the back of church.
