# Twenty-Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time - Year C



**Fr. Mark writes:** St. Paul urges us to engage with Scripture. 'All Scripture,' he reminds us, 'is profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness'. It is important that we have a good overview of the Bible as a whole. The passages we hear at Mass are obviously only a small selection, even sometimes of the particular book of the Bible they are taken from. We need to hear God's whole message — a message of challenge and of

consolation. The importance, therefore, of owing and reading our own Bible, of having a plan how to tackle it – starting probably with the Gospels, then St. Paul's Letters, the major prophets and the psalms.

#### **Annual Mass Count**

There was an average of 596 people at Mass each Sunday in the parish over the last month, an increase of 8% over the preceding year. (The two evening Masses saw the greatest growth.) This confirms what we are hearing of a modest revival in Church attendance. We are still a little below the pre-pandemic figure, but it is encouraging that we seem to be a significantly younger congregation than a few years ago.

There is an appointment system. To book an appointment, please E-Mail Jack, the catechist, at <a href="mailto:shepherdsbushcat@rcdow.org.uk">shepherdsbushcat@rcdow.org.uk</a> indicating which of the three sessions you can attend. He will confirm the time. In seeking a reference, you are asking the priest to confirm that your child is a baptised Catholic and you have attended Mass here each Sunday over a number of years. If you have recently moved into the parish or attend Mass more regularly elsewhere, it makes sense to seek a reference from that other parish.

#### **Our Beloved Dead**

November is the month when we pray particularly for the faithful departed:

- 1. **All Souls Day** will be kept this year on **Monday, 3 November.** Mass will be offered for the Holy Souls at **9.30 am** (when we are joined by the School) and at **7.00 pm**.
- 2. There are Holy Souls envelopes at the back of church. If you take one and return it with a list of your deceased family and friends and any Mass offering, Mass will be offered for them.
- 3. Our Parish Requiem Mass is at **7.00 pm** on **Friday, 7 November** for the repose of the souls of parishioners who have died over the last year. They will be prayed for by name and there will be the opportunity to light candles for them during the Mass. I have contacted the families to invite them to the Mass.
- 4. **Sunday, 9 November** is **Remembrance Sunday**. The **11.00 am** Mass will be a Requiem for the war dead.

#### **Marriage Preparation**

Catholics should marry in church to receive all the graces and blessings God wishes to give and we need for married and family life to flourish. Whether you plan marrying in the UK or overseas in 2026, there is a certain amount of documentation and preparation to be undertaken here. It is relatively straight forward provided a start is made at an early stage. If you plan to marry in 2026, please speak to Fr. Mark. One of the requirements is attendance at a marriage preparation course. We will have a course here over two afternoons, **2-5 pm, Saturday, 31 January** and **7 February**. This is the only course we will provide in the parish in 2026, although it may be possible to attend courses elsewhere.

# **Catholic Teaching Internships**

The diocesan Education Department offers a Catholic Leadership Programme to increase the number of Catholic teachers and promote teaching as a vocation. Paid internships allow Catholic university students to spend three weeks working in a Catholic school. There is a particular focus on RE, but the programme also welcomes students interested in other subjects and the primary sector. Bursaries are offered to pursuing QTS in RE.
