

Baptism of the Lord - Year A



Fr. Mark writes: St Peter tells us how at His baptism 'God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power'. In addition to the forgiveness of sin, the Holy Spirit is God's gift to us at baptism. In the chaos of the world situation, possibly also the confusion of our own lives, how much we need the power of the Holy Spirit. More than ever, we need wisdom, courage and gentleness. If we have been baptised, we have received the Holy Spirit already. (Of course, adults should also be confirmed so that we enjoy the fulness of the gifts of the Holy Spirit.) Then we activate the gifts of the Spirit by living lives in accordance with our faith, frequent reception of Holy Communion and Confession, and explicit prayer to the Holy Spirit, asking for His help, for Him to be active in our lives. Today let us thank God for the great gift of our own baptism and resolve to live more fully the vows made then and renewed at our Confirmation.

White Flower Appeal 2026

Today the Society for the Protection of Unborn Children (SPUC) holds its annual appeal. SPUC exists to transform culture so that abortion is not only abolished but becomes unthinkable. Marriage Preparation

Catholics should marry in church to receive God's graces and blessings which we need for married and family life to flourish. Whether you plan marrying in the UK or overseas in 2026, there is a certain amount of documentation and preparation to be undertaken here. It is relatively straight forward provided a start is made at an early stage. If you plan to marry in 2026, please speak to Fr. Mark. One of the requirements is attendance at a marriage preparation course. We will have a course here over two afternoons, **2-5 pm, Saturday, 31 January and 7 February**. This is the only course we will provide in the parish in 2026, although it may be possible to attend courses elsewhere.

Confirmation

Bishop Curry will celebrate Confirmation here at **12 noon on Saturday, 20 June 2026**. The programme is for those in school Year 9+ attending Sunday Mass here. It begins with a parents' meeting in church at **7.30 pm on Monday, 2 February**. From **Monday, 9 February**, the young people meet on Monday evenings in school term time with a day retreat on **Saturday, 25 April**. There are application forms and programmes at the back of church. Please return the completed application form by the end of the month with the fee of £50 and, if not baptised here, a copy of their baptism certificate.

Baptism

The Baptism of the Lord encourages us to think of the gift of the sacrament of baptism today. Baptism is crucial: through baptism Jesus becomes part of our lives and we part of His, what Jesus gained for us on the Cross is applied to the individual believer, we become children of God, we receive the Holy Spirit, what is wrong in the human condition is put right, we become members of the Church, the gates of heaven are thrown open to us. Because baptism is so open, the Church urges parents to bring their children to the sacrament in the first weeks of their life.

Baptism is about neither a cultural tradition nor school applications, but a living relationship with the Lord. Therefore, at least one of the parents must be a baptised, Mass-going Catholic themselves. Likewise, godparents should also be practising Catholics. For a first child, parents should attend a baptism preparation programme prior to the baptism. (This is not necessary for subsequent children.) We reflect on the meaning of baptism and Catholic family life. Let me know if there are any families looking for the baptism of a first child currently and we get dates in the diary for baptism preparation sessions.
